This is a short version of the Kanehelatúksla' the Thanksgiving Address or the Words before all Else in the Onyota'aka (Oneida) Language which is said by the Haudenosaunee peoples, It is known similarly as the Ganq̄he:nyq̄h in Onoñda'gega'(Onondaga), Ganö:nyög in Onöndowa'ga (Seneca), Ha? Kanq̄herathq̄reh) in Skarurekyé:ha? (Tuscarora), Ohen:ton Karihwatehkwen in Kanienkeha (Mohawk) and the Ganq̄honyq̄hk in Gayogohq̄:nq̄ (Cayuga) These are greetings to the natural world and it is said at the beginning and the end of each day or when there is a gathering of people.

Everyone listen for a little while.

The Proclamation of the Word

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.

The Collation of the Archdeacon for Indigenous Ministries and Reconciliation

The archdeacon stands before the bishop

Ephesians 4:11-13a

The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ.

Bishop: Rosalyn, it will be your task as Archdeacon for Indigenous Ministries to provide leadership in the work toward a deeper partnership in our common work of reconciliation. You are to share with the Bishop in the care and oversight of Indigenous ministries and projects so that this diocese may be a healthy part of an Indigenous resurgence in this time. You

and the author of our salvation;



