Music Notes

Blessed Jesus, At Your Word provides the thematic material for this morning's organ prelude. Written and composed for 17th century Lutheran worship as a hymn to be sung before the sermon, it would have been well known by both Walther's and Bach's parishioners. Organ voluntaries based on familiar hymns were and continue to be written as aids to worship, inviting worshippers to meditate on the hymn texts.

The text of *A Spendthrift Lover Is the Lord* is itself a meditation on our response (v. 3) to the One who calls Creation into being (v. 1) and then seeks to save us from ourselves through the incarnation and work of Christ (v. 3, "the bruised and thorn-crowned face of one who bears our scars"). Author, hymnist, and homiletics professor Thomas Troeger (1945-2022) spent his last 10 years teaching at his *alma mater*, Yale Divinity School. Composer and church musician Alfred Fedak has over 300 choral and organ works in print. As an organist, he serves both First Reformed Church in Scotia, NY and Congregation Beth Emeth in Albany.

We, the Lord's People is sung to the tune, Christe Sanctorum, a plainsong melody collected at Salisbury Cathedral, the original text being "Christ, the fair glory of the holy angels". Toronto organist-composer Derek Holman (1931-2019) has reharmonized the tune for Common Praise.

Thee Will I Love, My Strength, My Tower appealed so much to John Wesley that he translated it from its original German for his English congregations. The tune, Surrey, was first used for a metrical version of Psalm 23, written by English hymnwriter Joseph Addison (1672-1719).

Composer Louis Vierne was organist of Notre Dame in Paris, from 1900-1937. Composer and Improviser Jean Langlais was organist of St. Clotilde, Paris, from 1945-1987.
