Zoom Bible Study Adjourned The Tuesday morning Zoom Bible Study has adjourned for the holiday season. It will resume on Tuesday, January 10th, 2023.

Opportunity to make some extra cash – and attend concerts for free! We are in need of someone who can be present in the church while the groups are here.
