## An Update from the Refugee Committee

The Refugee Committee welcomed Alganesh, Binyam, and their two children to Canada on a snowy morning in late February.



June 18, 2023

In the weeks leading up to their arrival, committee members had leased an apartment and supplied it with everything a family would need to get started—including all furniture, kitchen utensils, winter clothing, a stocked pantry, and school supplies. Committee members also secured utilities and made a series of appointments to get the family started with their education, medical care, and other needs.

Then, following their arrival, committee members helped the family restart their lives here in Canada. The committee has also helped the family explore their new neighborhood, learn about shopping options, and enroll the children in school. The

family has learned our public transit system, completed their English language assessments, and started language classes.

Committee members assisted the family with the necessary tasks of opening bank accounts, transferring the lease and utilities into their own name, and other legal paperwork—all done with the

assistance of translators from the Multicultural Centre.

The Deanery created the current Refugee committee in response to the Syrian Crisis of 2015. With your support we have now sponsored and settled four families and have assisted two additional families who were initially sponsored by the federal government. In addition to the hands-on work of welcoming families and helping them learn about their new home, the Refugee Committee (with the federal



government) is responsible for rent and other routine expenses for the first year. Our thirteen deanery churches contributed more than \$104,300 to support the full sponsorship of our first four refugee families, or approximately \$25,000 for each family.

We have kept these expenses this low through a combination of careful shopping, many contributions of household items, and funding from grants and similar sources.



Inflation has dramatically increased the costs of rent, utilities, and similar monthly services. We estimate that we will need an additional \$10,400 over the next eight months to support our new family as they transition to their new home.
