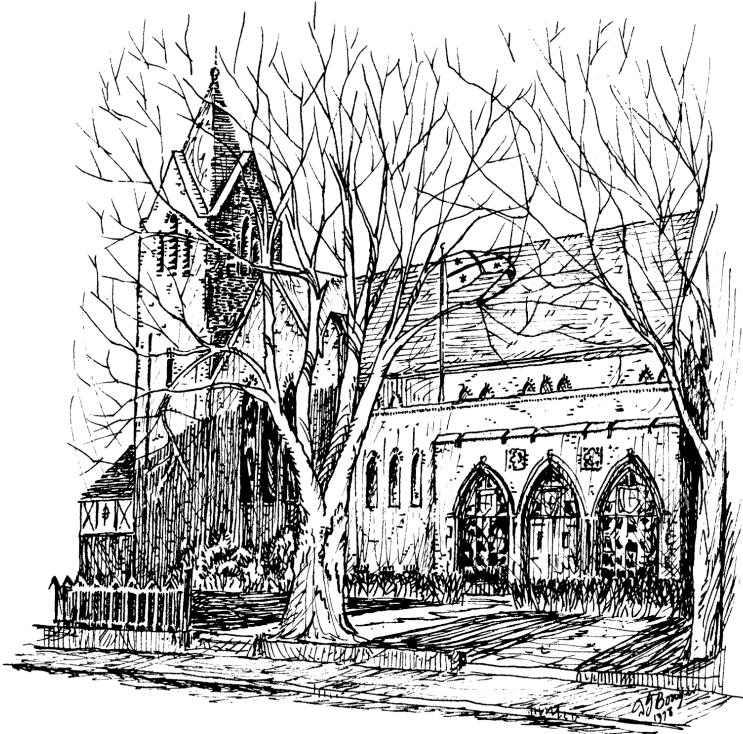


HOLY EUCHARIST
