

A Prayer for Important Moments

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (Eric Milner White, in **Daily Prayer**, 1941)

Eric Milner-White, OGS, (1884–1963) was an Anglican priest and military chaplain. He served as Dean of King's College, Cambridge, where he introduced the Service of Nine Lessons and Carols, familiar to many at St. John's. He was later appointed Dean of York. He was founder of the Oratory of the Good Shepherd, an Anglican dispersed community sharing a common rule and with present-day professed membership in Canada including that of The Rt. Rev. Bruce Myers, Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Quebec. Milner-White served as its superior from 1923 to 1938.

Transfiguration Sunday is the last Sunday after the Epiphany and concludes the Christmas Cycle of Advent, the Twelve Days of Christmas, and the Season of (after) Epiphany. We now begin the

Easter Cycle which includes Lent, the Great Three Days (Maundy Thursday into Good Friday, Good Friday into Holy Saturday and Holy Saturday into Easter Sunday) and the Season of Easter. It begins with Ash Wednesday (Feb 14 in 2024) and concludes on the Feast of Pentecost (May 19 in 2024).
