

We are entering the Season of Lent with the Sunday of the Transfiguration now behind us and Ash Wednesday now upon us.

Transfiguration concluded the *Christmas Cycle* of Advent, the Twelve Days of Christmas, and the Season of (after) Epiphany. We now begin the *Easter Cycle* which includes Lent, the Triduum (Maundy Thursday into Good Friday, Good Friday into Holy Saturday and Holy Saturday into Easter Sunday) and the Season of Easter.

So, the *Easter Cycle* begins today, on Ash Wednesday, and will conclude on the Feast of Pentecost which falls on May 19 in 2024.
